Third person correction appropriate for all other academic writing Shakespeare's play Hamlet deals with the relationships between family members. Writing in third person is writing from the third-person point of view, or outsider looking in, and uses pronouns like he, she, it, or they. Even if you intend to speak to a specific person, this word should be excluded from your academic paper. This point of view allows you not only to give the feelings and inner thoughts of the characters but also it allows you to unmask some of the events that will happen later on in the story. Leaving convention aside, first person is the only voice with a clear objective argument in favour of it: it avoids ambiguity as to who did what! For instance, to explain personal research results in third person, write I determined, rather than the research indicated. Third person limited is different from the first person in that there is a thin line separating the protagonist and the narrator. The instructors decided that the students should help pay for lab supplies. This is also the most prevalent convention in my community applied CS. You should be in a position to know when not to give some information. And yes, dismissing huge swaths of research as "more of an anecdote" does come off as snobbish. This is a warning sign that you are using the second person as this phrase does. My preference is very much for the active voice, first person plural in almost all cases.
